Fun Facts For January

- On average, it is the coldest month of the year in the Northern Hemisphere.
- It is the second month of Winter.
- In the Southern Hemisphere, January is a Summer month, the equivalent to July.
- Sometimes the Saxons called January the Wolf month, because hungry wolves would come into their towns searching for food during this time of the year.
- For a long period of European history, the start of the new year occurred in March instead of January.
- January is crowned as national soup month.
- Couples tend to separate or divorce more so in January than any other month of the year.
- In leap years, January always starts on the same day as April and July
- King Charlemagne would call January "Wintermanoth" meaning "winter/cold month.

This month in history

- 1622 The Catholic Church adopted 1 Jan as the beginning of the New Year (instead of 25 March).
- 1818 The first regular trans-Atlantic shipping service begins between Liverpool and New York.
- 1806 Lord Nelson, naval commander and hero of the Battle of Trafalgar, is buried at St. Paul's Cathedral in London.
- **1918** The House of Lords gives its approval to the Representation of the People Bill, which gives woman over the age of 30 the right to vote.
- 1970 The first Boeing 747 Jumbo jet arrives at London's Heathrow Airport after completing it's maiden transatlantic flight from New York.
- 1846 The first edition of the Daily News, edited by Charles Dickens is published in London.
- 1965 The "last lion of British politics", Sir Winston Churchill died at the age of 90. His body is to lie in state in Westminster Hall, London.
- 1807 London becomes the first city in the world to be lit by gas lights.
- 1596 The most famous English seaman and adventurer of the Elizabethan era, Sir Frances Drake, is buried at sea. The Spanish breathed a sigh of relief!
- 1759 Birth of Robert "Rabbie" Burns, Scottish poet. Burns Suppers celebrated all over the world each year on this day.
- 1912 Britain's polar explorers led by Captain Robert Falcon Scott reach the South Pole only to find the Norwegian Roald Amundsen's expedition had beaten him by a month.
- 1780 British forces under the command of Admiral Rodney defeat the Spanish at Cape St. Vincent and relieve Gibraltar.
- 1967 Death of Donald Campbell. His jet-powered speedboat Bluebird somersaulted on Coniston Water, Cumbria, at a speed of 300-mph whilst attempting to break his own world record of 276-mph.

What Does January Symbolise?

- January's birthstone is the garnet, which represents constancy.
- January's birth flower is the cottage pink Dianthus caryophyllus or Galanthus
- The zodiac signs for the month of January were Capricorn (until January 19, 2020) and Aquarius (January 20, 2020 onwards). For 2021 the dates will shift to 18–19, due to the leap day in 2020.
